FortisBC Gas Operating Agreement Negotiations and BCUC Application for Reconsideration

At approximately 1:25 pm, Jerry Berry and Gord Schoberg from FortisBC and Brian Clemens, Nanaimo City CFO joined the group for the discussion. Jerry and Gord updated the members on the current status of the Application for Reconsideration through BCUC which is in Phase 1 with Fort Nelson being taken out of the affected areas; the near completion of the pro-forma operating agreement; and Saanich CAO Paul Murray replacing Doug Holmes as senior staff representative on the file. It was noted that if the Application for Reconsideration fails, the option of an appeal through the civil process remains. Brian Clemens distributed a one-page briefing note that they had developed to support advocacy on the issue and noted that they were willing to share a template to prepare locally relevant statistics. It was clarified that there are two separate issues: common rates which affects all natural gas consumers and will the ability to implement operating fees which is specific to local governments who might qualify.

Next steps:

ADJOURNMENT

- Jerry Berry and Brian Clemens to support Working Group Members to help them develop their own locally relevant information.
- Brief BCUC staff on the pro-forma operating agreement seeking their support followed by bringing a pilot signed pro-forma agreement for approval. Consensus was that it would be appropriate to have City of Nanaimo be the pilot organization if they were willing.
- Jerry Berry and Paul Murray to meet with Ministry staff to provide an update and confirm steps needed to update legislation to allow operating fees.
- AVICC to request a meeting through one of our members (potential: Nanaimo RD, Saanich or Nanaimo City) with appropriate Ministers during the UBCM Convention to reiterate the importance of the Application for Reconsideration and support needed for changing the legislation to allow operating fees.

Changes Required to Watersheds Legislation
