## AVICC and the Island Corridor Foundation

- Extremely important forum for the ICF
  - The roots of the ICF are here
    - AVICC passed a motion in 2003 to evaluate a private-public partnership with First Nations and Regional Districts to own and manage the corridor
    - Led to the formation of the ICF
  - The future of the ICF is here
    - Ultimately the ICF is a representative organization
    - We work on <u>behalf</u> of our members
      - » First Nations and Regional Districts
      - » The people of Vancouver Island



# The Background and Timeline

- Meetings last fall with the Premier and Ministry of Transportation
  - It was clear the Premier was frustrated
    - Fair to say that frustration was shared by all
  - Provincial focus was on the Capital Regional District
    - ICF focus has to be and will continue to be the entire island
      - Work can be done incrementally
      - Must have agreement on the entire island before any work starts
    - ICF maintains there has to be a shared vision
  - The Premier called a meeting of the stakeholders to determine the future of the corridor
    - Meeting was held on December 10, 2018



# The Background and Timeline

- Outcome of the Roundtable Meeting
  - First Nations and Stakeholders clearly stated
    - Rail is a key infrastructure element
    - Rail is an integral part of a comprehensive transportation strategy for the island
    - There needs to be a clear commitment from the Province to
      - Re-instate rail service on the entire island
      - Work with ICF as the owner of the Corridor
    - Works needs to be undertaken without delay
    - All work must consider the needs and concerns of our First Nations Partners



#### **Current Status**

- The Province has commissioned an assessment of the Corridor
  - This is a repeat of the IBI Study from 2010
- We agree an assessment is required but
  - Not necessarily the approach
    - Seismic Testing? Costs to retrofit Bridges & Tunnels to today's standards?
  - The Foundation did not participate in development of the assessment or the selection of the Proponent
  - Expected completion of Oct 2019
    - Feed into South Island Transportation Study March 2020
      - "To determine if rail is even required"
  - We could have had an operating system in same timeframe



# Moving Forward

- We are pleased that an assessment is being done
  - Commend the Province for taking a step in right direction –
    Make no mistake...this is the right direction
  - At the same time we do have some concerns
    - Timing current estimates could take us to the next Provincial election
    - We have been here before and sincerely hope this is not going to be another study to add to the pile of studies
    - Analysis Paralysis
    - The Province is acting alone no consultation with the ICF
  - Bottom line we are cautiously optimistic



## Between Now and November

- We will work with the Province and its Proponent
  - Ensure the assessment moves forward without delay
- Continue to look for ways to advance this critically important project
  - For all the people of Vancouver Island
- We will ensure stakeholders are kept informed as we move forward and that your voices are heard
