



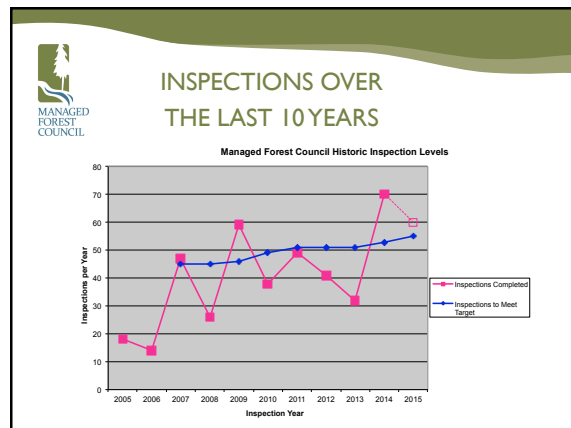

Introducing the Managed Forest Council

As of September 2014 the Private Managed Forest Land Council will now be known as the Managed Forest Council. Although the 21 legal entities that make up this working name and the 100+ staff and 100+ volunteer staff, many other organizations associated with the forest land in British Columbia.


Managed Forest Council is an independent provincial agency established under the Forest Act to administer the Managed Forest Program and protect key public interests.
