President Jensen advised that he had contacted the Deputy Minister from the Ministry of Indigenous Relations and Reconciliation regarding approval to use the remaining treaty advisory committee funds, and had not received a response to date. He has directed the Secretary-Treasurer to draft a letter for Minister Fraser requesting approval to use the funds to support AVICC's relationship with indigenous groups within the AVICC region.

CONVENTION

2020 Convention Update

Liz Cookson reviewed updates to planning for the 2020 Convention since the October 25th Executive Committee meeting. She confirmed that Joe Roberts, Skid Row CEO has been contracted as the keynote speaker for the amount approved at the October 25th meeting of \$5,000 plus expenses.

A quote from the band selected at the October 25th meeting has been received for \$5,500, and their selection was confirmed with President Jensen. The band's name is Time Well Wasted. The RD of Nanaimo staff advised they may be able to contribute to the additional cost of the band within their budget that was set aside for the convention.

The Secretary-Treasurer advised that efforts were being made to get input from the host communities, and to ensure that they are well showcased. The host community staff liaisons will continue to be the contact point for the AVICC, and will be responsible for collecting and feeding information back to their organizations. They have been reminded that there is a clear distinction between hosting the convention and holding the convention, and that it is an AVICC event. The host responsibilities documents set out that AVICC seeks input from the host communities, but makes all the decisions on convention content and materials. These documents were sent to the host communities for their review and endorsement prior to their approval of hosting. Their agreement to host under these terms was done by resolution of the Council and the Board of the respective host communities.

AVICC will continue its practice of supporting local businesses as much as possible including wine, beer and "Island Good" food at the conference centre. These local purchases come at an additional cost. Speaker gifts will be from St. Jean's cannery. The cannery was purchased in 2016 by Nuu-chah-nulth Seafood Development Corporation and uses wild seafood in its products.

The report provided background on child care at the UBCM convention, and child care options that the Coast Bastion Hotel provides to its guests. President Jensen and EA Representative Craig will review further.

AVICC sponsor COFI has offered to provide an additional reception at the 2020 Convention following the Friday night Welcome Reception. The Executive would like to see more presence from COFI at the reception such as a speech from the COFI representative.

2020 Convention Session Proposals

Liz Cookson reviewed the report in the meeting package outlining the number and timing of sessions for the convention program. She reviewed the process followed in seeking proposal submissions and noted that a summary of submissions was included in the report, and the full submissions were attached as an appendix.

The review at today's teleconference is a preliminary one to help draft the program for the 2020 Convention, and to determine if additional information is required before the January 4th in-person meeting in Nanaimo. Final decisions are normally made at the January meeting of the Executive Committee. The report outlined considerations that the Executive may wish to incorporate when choosing from the proposed sessions including representation of the host communities; relevance of sponsor proposals; representation of a variety of viewpoints from larger and smaller communities; and whether a change of presenter would affect whether or not the session would be selected.

President Jensen noted that he had previously sent out an email asking each Executive member to identify their top 4 or 5 sessions for 2020. He proposed that rather than going through each proposal as a group and rating each one that members identify their top sessions. The Executive members supported this change in the review process.
