Dear Minister Malcolmson,

The Association of Vancouver Island and Coastal Communities (AVICC) is the Union of BC Municipalities (UBCM) area association representing the interests of local governments and member First Nations in the British Columbia region of Vancouver Island, qathet, the Sunshine Coast, Central Coast and North Coast.

Following consideration at the 2026 AVICC Annual Convention, AVICC members endorsed two resolutions related to post-secondary affordability and poverty reduction that pertain to your Ministry. The resolutions and supporting background information are included for your review and consideration:

- **Resolution 2026-R37 – Student Food Security Grant**
- **Resolution 2026-R38 – Post-Secondary Affordability**

These resolutions recognize the significant financial pressures facing post-secondary students across British Columbia, including rising food costs, housing affordability challenges, and barriers to accessing opportunities that contribute to academic success and workforce development.

The resolutions call on the Province to implement the recommendations contained within the [Student Issues Backgrounder 2025](#). One of the recommendations (found on pages 4-8 of the backgrounder) is to create a \$1.50 per student “Student Food Security Grant” to be used to support student food banks. This measure, along with the other recommendations in the backgrounder, are intended to improve affordability, food security, mobility, and overall student well-being.

Students are our communities’ future workforce, community leaders, professionals, entrepreneurs, and elected officials of our communities. AVICC believes it is important that students have a voice in conversations affecting their future and that their perspectives be reflected in discussions taking place at the local government table. AVICC members believe that improving affordability and accessibility for post-secondary students is an investment in British Columbia’s future workforce, economic competitiveness, and community well-being.
